#### **Arran Street Hotel**

We are delighted to have been appointed Main Contractor on the new eight storey, 273-bedroom hotel on the site of the existing Fruit and Vegetable Wholesale Warehouse in Dublin's Markets area for Creekvale Ltd.

The hotel will be located at Arran Street East and Little Mary Street adjacent to the historic Fruit & Vegetable Markets.

The new hotel development will make a notable contribution to the continued rejuvenation of the area by generating footfall and

activity. In addition, the development will redevelop and existing underused property and enable the provision of high quality, modern hotel accommodation.

The development will consist of demolition of the existing 2 no. to 3 no. storey buildings & construction of a part 5 & part 8 storey 273 bedroom hotel building of approximately 9,600.30sq.m over a single basement, with frontages to Arran Street East and Little Mary Street.



## Lumcloon & Shannonbridge BESS Facilities

The Lumcloon 100MW BESS Facility and Shannonbridge 100MW BESS Facility have both officially reached energisation!

The new BESS plants will be in keeping with the heritage and tradition of power generation in the area of the two sites, albeit with a modern technology, reflecting the evolution of the power industry through the years.

The BESS projects utilise high power batteries to provide system services to suit the Irish Power System need, under the DS3 System Service Programme.

The BESS will provide system services to the Power System, which are required by the system operator to enhance the management of the transmission grid, ultimately increasing the stability, and improving the reliability of the electricity supply to consumers.

Duggan Brothers are delighted to have managed the construction and energisation of both these highly effective and efficient source of system services to the power system, offering high availability with minimal down time for maintenance outages.

# Dublin Simon Community - New 100 Bed Medical Centre

We recently marked the first major milestone for Duggan Brothers (Contractors) Ltd; the Department of Housing; and the Dublin Simon Community on the new 100-Bed Medical Centre for the Dublin Simon Community.

The formal contract signing took place on Tuesday 27th of July for the greatly anticipated €23M Medical Centre, which will provide fantastic support for Dublin's homeless population. Minister for Housing, Darragh O'Brien was in attendance on the day to show his support for the new facility.

We are delighted to have been appointed Main Contractor for the construction of this much needed facility and look forward delivering a facility that will meet the needs of the homeless population. Construction works on the new 100-bed facility are due to commence on Monday 9th August, with works expected to take 30 months to complete. The new facility will be located at Usher's Island and will be partially funded by the Department of Housing and will be operated by the Dublin Simon Community.

When completed the facility with deliver residential medical, treatment and recovery services to meet the complex healthcare needs of people experiencing homelessness in Dublin, including detox, rehabilitation, semi-acute medical procedures and blood borne virus stabilisation. In recent months these services have been moved temporarily to other locations in the city in order to decant the site for the construction phase

We were once again delighted to welcome visitors to our site when the 'European Council of Construction Economists' (CEEC) delegation visited our Enniskerry Road project.

The SCSI hosted CEEC representatives from across Europe in Dublin last week. This project which is nearing completion comprises 155 homes along with associated external works at Enniskerry Road, Stepaside, Co Dublin.





#### **Dorset Street Hotel**

As works are in the final stages of completion on the Dorset Street Hotel Development, we have taken time to reflect on some of the challenges that the project has presented and how we overcame them.

One of the biggest challenges that we faced throughout this project was to retain the existing façade at ground floor and above first floor while removing the existing basement floor, walls, ground floor internal walls and floor slab. We Excavated the basement and constructed a new slab and frame to above ground floor level.

In order to successfully complete the works, we installed a new structural steel frame above ground floor to first floor level in order to carry the existing building, also supporting the existing frame from 1st to 3rd floor with new structural steel.

A temporary works solution was designed and installed starting with pads foundations excavated and concreted below the new proposed basement floor slab. Installation of a temporary structural steel frame from basement to 3rd floor. The building was completely supported on this frame and all existing masonry and steel supports removed below the first floor.

The existing façade at ground floor level on Dorset Street and North Circular Road was retained. In addition, the existing brick façade above 1st floor on all four elevations was retained. A new RC frame from basement to ground floor and a new structural frame from ground floor to fourth floor. A new roof and drainage install along with new windows to the hotel bedrooms. Above 1st floor will form part of the new Hendrick Hotel.



## Stepaside Cost Rental Development

The State's first purpose-built cost rental scheme has officially launched Applications for the state's first purpose-built cost rental scheme, located off the Enniskerry Road, on Dublin's south side.

We are delighted to be delivering this project for both Respond and Tuath Housing, which will offer low- and middle-income households the choice of a more affordable, long term and stable form of rental tenure than exists presently, with the added benefit that their rent will not be driven by market price changes in the private rental market.

50 two-bedroom apartments will be available for rent at a monthly cost of €1200 to low- and middle-income workers at prices up to 30% below market rents for the area, under the new pilot cost rental scheme. The scheme is aimed at individuals who are above the threshold for social housing but are unable to afford a home of their own.

The rent of €1200 per month, which is based on the cost of delivering and maintaining the homes, is a significant reduction when compared to market rents for two-bedroom apartments in this location.

Housing agencies Respond and Tuath Housing will manage the homes. Eligible tenants will be randomly chosen in a lottery style selection process.

The site in Stepaside will also provide 105 social homes which will be shared out between Respond & Tuath Housing.

#### **Christmas in Templemore**


We have decided to organise something a little different this year, after both the success of our Summer BBQ & recent requests from staff members for a joint Christmas Party.
