Tom Johnson House

We are pleased to announce that we have officially commenced works on the deep retrofit of Tom Johnson House, Beggar's Bush, Dublin 4. This project has been selected as a Public Sector Retrofit Pathfinder Project and we are proud to have been appointed by the Office of Public Works (OPW) to this prestigious project. The OPW is responsible for several key roles within the project (Employer, Architects, Contract Administrators, etc.)

The completed project will be an exemplar, energy efficient, State office for occupation as a Headquarters Building by the lead Irish Government Department on the environment - the Department of the Environment, Climate and Communications.

The works will consist of a significant upgrade to the 1970s building thermal fabric and overall energy use that will upgrade the Building Energy Rating (BER) from a G rating to an A2 rating, resulting in an 85% reduction of annual energy use and will greatly extend the buildings useful life.

The refurbishment will retain the existing 1970s structure, taking advantage of the energy already embodied in the concrete structure and brick external façade. By retaining and upgrading these resources rather than demolishing and rebuilding, the works will have significantly less impact on the carbon footprint of the building. Internally, the existing cellular office layout will be modified to a more open plan arrangement increasing the overall building occupancy – while the introduction of a new central floor void will create improved daylight and natural ventilation conditions.

The embodied carbon in those existing structures will considerably mitigate the climate change impact of the investment when compared with any new build option. Use of heat pump technology and the application of the OPW's Green Procurement Policy will also mitigate the climate change impact of the project. All EU Regulatory requirements in relation to building material inputs, waste management and the re-use and recycling of waste materials have been incorporated into the project Works Requirements.

On completion of this deep retrofit project, Tom Johnson House will act as an exemplar in the transformation of existing buildings for future use. The building, which was recently occupied by the Labour Relations Commission and the Geological Survey of Ireland, will become the new headquarters of the Department of Environment, Climate & Communications (DECC)



State's First Cost Rental Housing **Development Officially Launched**

The first purpose-built costrental homes in Ireland at the Woodside Development on the Enniskerry Road, have been officially launched. The development, completed by **Duggan Brothers (Contractors)** Ltd as a collaboration between Respond & Tuath Approved Housing Bodies comprises 50 cost-rental homes which are part of an overall development of 155 social and affordable homes, a community facility, and green spaces.

The homes are a mix of one-, two- and three-bedroom properties, while all 50 costrental homes in the complex are two-bedroom apartments. Previous cost-rental housing developments were as a result of acquisitions by Approved Housing Bodies. The Woodside development was

commissioned for the purpose of providing cost-rental and social housing.

The cost-rental model means that the price of rent is equal to the delivery cost of the scheme alone. Tenants are charged an amount that covers the cost of delivering, managing, and maintaining a home only. This means prices are not driven by market movements, making it more affordable.

Housing Minister Darragh O'Brien said the rent of €1,200 per month is about 40% below the average rent in the area. He said it is not just the lower rent that tenants are availing of, but also the secure tenancy. The government has promised 2,000 cost rental homes a year until 2030.

Barry Andrews MEP who attended the launch said the Woodside scheme had been commended by the European Parliament's Social and Employment Committee as an example of an innovative way to address the housing crisis.

We are pleased to have been involved in the delivery of this significant development which will provide much-needed social and affordable housing for Dublin.









Duggan Brothers Project Manager, Pat O'Neill shortlisted for ICE Awards and Chartered Institute of Building (CIOB) Awards



DBL Celebrated International Women's Day

International Women's Day is a global day to celebrate the social, economic, cultural, and political achievements of women. The day marks a call to action to increase and accelerate gender equality globally, in every aspect of life.

We were delighted to be at the CIF International Women's Day Event at Clontarf Castle again this year. The gathering, held in person for the first time in almost two years, attracted many of the industries leaders and influencers.

A variety of topics were covered throughout the day on diversity, equality and women in construction. There was a major emphasis on the number of women working in the industry and how that has increased over the past year.

"Figures show total construction employment grew by 23,200 over the course of 2021, rising from 135,200 in Q4 2020 to 158,400 in Q4 2021. During that same period, the level of

female employment in the sector grew from 8,500 to 14,400."

By the end of 2021 there were 14,400 women working within the construction industry in the Republic of Ireland. That represents 9.1% of total employment in our industry. The figures also tell us that throughout 2021, for every new member entering the industry 1 in 4 was female. Admittedly it is nowhere near where we would like the figure to be but as far as records show there has never been as many women working in the Irish Construction sector as there are now.

Ireland is not alone in needing a much higher proportion of women in our industry. This seems to be an international truth which stretches well beyond our shores. We hope that we can continue to see these figures increase and create a balance in the industry going forward.



Irish Construction Excellence Awards 2022

We are delighted to announce that we are finalists in the "Leisure or Tourism Over €10M" category at this years Irish Construction Excellence Awards for the distinguished Wren Urban Nest Hotel Development.

The Wren Hotel makes the most of its tight urban site offering 137 compact and luxurious bedrooms in the heart of Dublin. The small format hotel nestles sensitively into its context at Andrew's Lane. A series of brick arches on the ground and first floor allows light to flood the public spaces while creating a sense of lightness to the volume. Approached under a cantilever arch, the entrance provides a welcoming step down across tiered seating acknowledging the sites theatrical past, while offering an open street corner to both pedestrians and traffic.

A restrained material approach draws reference to the rich character of Dublin's streets, with the ground brick stretching up the façade across eight levels of boutique guestrooms. Across the westerly elevation, each room finishes with a sense of

openness offered by expansive articulated glazing. The internal pallet of character and craft, guiding the guest through corridors articulated to reflect the exterior form.

This interdisciplinary project is designed to be one of the first hotels in the capital to fulfil with the near zero energy building standards. It hosts air source heat pumps that will provide heating and cooling to all the building.

The ICE Awards Gala Event is due to take place on Saturday, 14th May 2022.



OPW Appoints DBL on Leeson Lane Office Development

We are delighted to announce that Duggan Brothers (Contractors) Ltd have been appointed main contractor on the upcoming development of Leeson Lane office building in Dublin 2, on behalf of the OPW. The completed project will operate as a flexible, multi-occupancy government headquarters and will be an exemplar for energy efficiency.

The project is funded by the Office of Public Works . On completion, the development of this brownfield site will act as a flagship office development for the OPW, being space efficient and compliant with nZEB, while restoring and safeguarding a fine example of built heritage into the future and enhancing the urban realm.

The project involves the restoration and refurbishment of historic Spruce House, a former dispensary building, and the construction of a new 7-storey office building, linked to the rear of the dispensary building at ground and first floor levels. Site development works also involve the reinstatement of the historic laneway Leeson Place.

In compliance with the European Energy Performance of Buildings Directive, the new building has been designed to achieve nZEB (nearly Zero Energy Buildings) standard with a very high energy performance. The building will be predominantly naturally ventilated, and a significant amount of its energy requirements will come from renewable sources. Use of heat pump technology and the application of the OPW's Green Procurement Policy will further mitigate the climate change impact of the project.

All EU regulatory requirements in relation to building material inputs, waste management and the re-use and recycling of waste materials have been incorporated into the project works requirements.



Minister for Housing Darragh O'Brien visits Sean Foster Place

We were delighted to welcome Minister For Housing, Darragh O'Brien to our site on North King Street. We are delivering this project on behalf of Dublin City Council and on completion the project will comprise 30 one-, two-& three-bedroom homes, all of which are being built to nearly zero energy building (NZEB) standards.

The new social housing scheme has been named after "Sean Foster" as a mark of remembrance to the first

child killed during the 1916 Easter Rising. Sean Foster was only 2 years old when he was killed by a gunshot to the head as he was wheeled in his pram along North King Street.

North King Street was the centre of heavy fighting during the rebellion, which led to the death of 16 civilians on this street - 9 of which were killed on the site of the new development.


Woodside Development wins Social Housing Development of the Year Award
